About the Piece

Though this Gaelic prayer is usually known by its first line, "As the Rain," the title has been changed to clarify the main message of the poem for this choral setting. "Thou Dost Not Fall" is an affirmation that, no matter how difficult and dark life's happenings can be, God is trustworthy.

The voices open with a drone-like introduction that sets a lonely mood. The piece entermarch-like, resolute, and hopeful repetitions of the lines "it is enough to know Thou dost not fall." The melody and the open fifths found throughout the piece pays mage to the Celtic heritage of the lyrics, while offering a dramatic treatment of the text.
