Note from the Composer

Promise was written in memory of Sydney Siefert, a student at Olentangy Liberty High School in Powell, Ohio, who lost her life in a car accident at the age of 17. She was also an organ donor and her heart was transplanted to give life to a gravely ill patient. These two facts play an important part in the creation of this anthem.

Promise is a work of interplay between opposites – sadness and joy, tragedy and blessing, death and rebirth, sorrow and hope. There is a profound melancholy in the harmony that always leads to a sense of wonder and quietude. There are also exquisite opportunities for text painting – the opening "dripping" figure in the accompaniment, the women's cascading lines in "snow caps melt slowly" and the ascent from unison to close harmony in "rise in a fine mist of dreams". Susan Boersma's final lyrics serve as a benediction for the entire anthem – "light of the promise that beats in a heart of love". – Craig Courtney

Note from the Lyricist


